Re: Changes to prenatal website

This memo is regarding changes to online prenatal resources provided by Public Health.

To support universal access to prenatal information and support, the Welcome to Parenting online platform was launched on September 15, 2014. A recent review of the Welcome to Parenting data indicated that the rate of new users has decreased and online class participation is low. Since the launch of Welcome to Parenting, a number of new and updated pregnancy and parenting websites are available. Based on these findings and the availability of credible online resources, the Welcome to Parenting contract will not be renewed.

As of September 30, 2018, new users in Nova Scotia will not be able to register on the Welcome to Parenting online platform. Existing participants will have access to the site until December 31, 2018. When users log onto the Welcome to Parenting landing page, there will be a notification message providing this information.

Public Health's 'Pregnancy & Parenting Support' webpage—<u>www.nshealth.ca/pregnancyandparenting</u>—has been updated and includes a variety of credible resources and information for families. This page will also be available in French at www.nshealth.ca/pregnancyandparenting-fr.

New Pregnancy and Parenting Support cards have been produced with this website information and will be provided to you (primary care providers, hospital staff and community partners) to distribute to the clients and families you are working with. If you don't receive the cards or would like to order more cards, contact Public Health. The cards will replace both the Welcome to Parenting and Loving Care cards. Please remove any existing Welcome to Parenting cards or posters that you may have and replace with the new Pregnancy and Parenting cards that you will receive.
